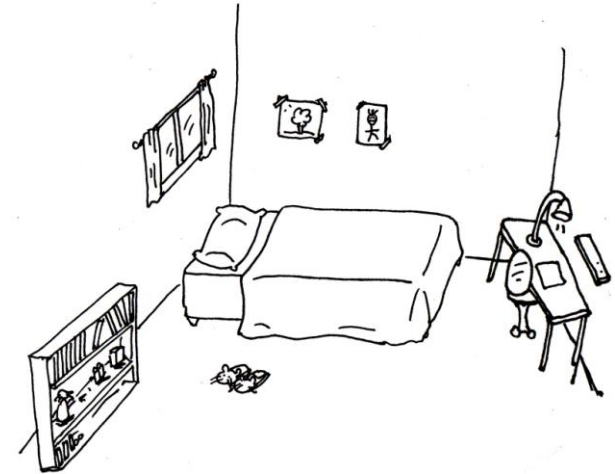


## My Bedroom

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## How to play the Back2Back Bedroom Game

### Before the activity:

Cut up all the cards in twos as shown below. Each 'two' is actually one card. You have to fold them in half and stick them together so 'This is my' is on one side and 'bed' on the other. Shuffle the cards and place them with the **star face up**.

### The game:

'This is my' is the first card. The teacher turns over this card to reveal the word 'bed' on the other side.

The students have to find the word 'room' pick it up and turn it over to reveal the next word. The game ends with the student turn over the card and finds 'This is my bedroom'.
