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## 4 in a Row - Pronouns

### How to play the 4 in a Row Game.

#### Before the game:

Cut up all the cards from pages 2 to 4.

Shuffle the cards and place them face down in the middle of the group.

You will need two different sets of coloured counters.

#### The Game:

Divide the group in half. Each group or student in turn, turns over a card. The student reads the card, for example, 'The dogs are sleeping.' The student then places one of his/her coloured counters on the board in one of the 'THEY' squares.

The next group or student then turns over a card, for example, 'The shop is open.' The student then places one of his/her coloured counters on the board in one of the 'IT' squares.

The group or student that completes for in a row, either horizontally, vertically or diagonally is the winner.
