Game 6 - Colours - Memory Game

How to play

Spread the cards face down in the middle of the group. The first player turns over two cards and reads the words or names the colour. If the player turns over a pair (for example: the word and its matching colour) he keeps it and then has

another turn to find a pair. Then it is the next player's turn. If the player doesn't turn over a pair he places the cards face down and then it is next player's turn.

The player with the most pairs is the winner.

Other options for using the memory game cards. Roundabout

You need a die and counters.

How to play

Lay the one set of colour cards in the middle of the group, face up. Place the other set around them in a circle.

Players put their counters anywhere on the cards in the outer circle. The players move in the same direction.

The first player rolls the die and moves according to the

number on the die. The player names the colour he lands on and finds the corresponding card from the middle and takes it. It is the next player's turn. He lands on a colour card and names it. If the corresponding card is still is still in the middle, the player takes the card. If the card has been taken, play continues.

The game ends when there are no cards in the middle. The player with the most cards is the winner.

Guess. Divide the cards into two sets (picture & word). The teacher uses only the picture cards. She holds the pack in her hand face down and gives a card to the first player. The player looks at it. The other players have to guess what the card is. For example, "Do you have the colour red?" If the player has that colour he says, "Yes, I do," and places the card in the middle of the group. It is then the next player's turn. The teacher gives a card to the next player and the others have to guess what it is, etc. If the player doesn't have 'red' he says, "No, I don't". The teacher places the red card, in the middle of the group, face up. It is then the next player's turn to guess the colour. The teacher uses both sets of cards. One set is spread out, in the middle of the group, face up. The teacher holds the other set in her hand and gives a card to the first player. The player looks at it and the other players have to guess what the card is. For example, "Do you have the colour red?" If the student has that colour she says, "Yes, I do." and gives the card back to the teacher who then shuffles the cards and starts again. If the player doesn't have 'red' she says, "No, I don't" and turns

over the 'red', in the middle
